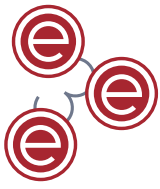

Lesson	Topic	Content/Context
1	A career in law	Assess participants' oral skills in English; making introductions; creating a friendly and comfortable learning environment; providing course syllabus and relevant information; introducing the general theme of law and law firms. Functional language area: structuring a legal presentation
2	Contract law, remedies for breach of contract, contract clauses and provisions	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of contract law, conditions and warranties, asking for clarification and providing explanations and advice (orally and in writing)
3	Tort law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of lawyer/client interaction, defending or denying allegations, asking for information, reporting procedural history
4	Criminal law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of white-collar crime (insider dealing and market abuse), talking about cause and effect, giving advice through role-play) and expressing obligation



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5	Company law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of company law, BoD's meeting, reading a statute, discussing advantages and disadvantages
6	Commercial law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of commercial law and commercial agency contracts, discussion options, fields, institutions and concepts in commercial law
7	Real property law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of real property and property investment law, draft tenancy and purchase agreements, conveyancing, instruments and people in the area of real property
8	Litigation and arbitration	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of litigation and arbitration, avoiding litigation, assessing costs, responding to a letter before action, establishing facts
9	International law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of Developments in EU law, different jurisdictions and patent laws, legal instruments
10	Comparative law	Review and expand students' knowledge and English language skills around the general topics of comparative law, asset protection advice
